MAMBA HOW TO STAY SAFE DURING A HIJACKING

STAY ALERT

Be vigilant at all times and be aware of your surroundings.

SPACE BETWEEN CARS

Keep enough space between your car and others to avoid being an easy target for hijackers.

SCOUT FOR DANGER

Adopt a search pattern radius to scout before approaching your home.

DON'T ARGUE

In order to avoid any violence, don't argue with your hijacker.

MIX UP YOUR ROUTES

Mix up the routes on your GPS to throw off potential criminals that could be following you.

SUSPICIOUS CAR

If you are being followed, drive to the nearest public space, like a service station or shopping centre. Don't go home.

ADJUST SPEED WHEN STOPPING

Adjust your speed when approaching a traffic light so that you do not have to come to a complete stop.

ESCAPE IF YOU CAN

Try to get away from the situation as soon as possible. Your life is worth more than your car.

GET AN ELECTRIC GATE

Many hijackings happen as you arrive at your house. Electric gates can help you get in and out safely.

GATE TIMERS

Take the timer off your electric gate motor, the sooner you can close your gate after pulling into your driveway, the better.

AVOID EYE CONTACT

Don't make eye contact but try to remember specific features.

WAIT FOR GATE

Try to wait in the street for your gate to open, not in your driveway, for a quick getaway.

REVERSE PARKING

Try to always park facing out. This provides a quick get away from a suspicious situation.

GET TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS

Be aware of the cars your neighbours drive. This will help to identify any uncommon vehicles in your area.

STAY CALM

When confronted with a hijacker, stay calm and don't make any sudden movements.

BE SEEN AND HEARD

Should you see suspicious activity; hoot, scream, blow a whistle and try to attract as much attention as possible.
